Synopsis of the meeting

Dr. Gautam welcomed all the participants to the meeting and provided brief updates on the responses of MoHP to manage and control COVID-19. The details of tests and isolation/quarantine of COVID-19 cases as of 1st July 2020 were also provided.

Dr. Gautam thanked all the health partners for generous supports through one door mechanism. He specially thanked China Railway 14th Bureau Group Co. Ltd., Nepal Red Cross Society, Coco Cola Foundation, Singapore Red Cross, IFRC, Prarambha Nepal and Ani Choying Dolma Foundation for their support in COVID-19 response in the past week.

Dr. Ramesh Kharel, Director, Management Division then provided information about requirements, stocks, gaps and procurement plan for COVID-19 testing laboratory items (RNA

He also informed about the procurement of 7 automated RNA extraction machine to increase the output and meet the target of 10,000 tests per day. He also provided the approved distribution/supply chain management flow chart with slight



modification (addition of laboratory). He thanked all the partners for their support and stressed on use of eLMIS and one door mechanism for logistics recording and reporting. He also asked all the health partners to check quality and compatibility of the support (specially laboratory reagents).



Dr. Lungten Wangchuk, Co-chair then provided brief updates from health partners and their supports on COVID-19 response. She also provided the updates on activities of the Mental Health subcluster and informed that MHPSS services like risk communication/community awareness, tele-mental health and service, mental health and psychosocial support to persons in isolation and quarantine and in communities were available in all 7 provinces. She thanked all the health partners for aligning their support to the key asks from MoHP. She also stressed on providing support to hospitals for management of COVID-19

cases such as ventilators, oxygen concentrators, expansion of isolation in COVID designated hospitals.

Mr. Ram Naresh Yadav, Manager-Public Health, from Good Neighbors International (GNI) informed about the goals and objectives of the organization and the different health projects the organization has been working on. He also provided the details of COVID-19 support by the organization (a sum of NRs 44,282,497 from a total budget of NRs 82,015,891). He provided with the future plan of the organization in COVID-19 response and other health related activities and also informed about the different challenges that are being faced in the support. He informed that they can align their support as needed and plan accordingly.

Dr. Lungten thanked GNI for reaching to the provinces and areas requiring their support in COVID-19 response as well as appreciated the information provided on their future plan willingness to align support to MoHP Asks. She also appreciated the supports provided by all other health partners in COVID-19 response. She thanked Dr. Ramesh for providing the information on gaps in COVID-19 logistics thereby helping health partners to realign their supports to fill the gaps. She also stressed on checking quality and compatibility of laboratory supports and using eLMIS to provide support as suggested by Dr. Ramesh. She also stressed that partners to provide support through one door mechanism as per the ask from MoHP and the Chair of the HC.

Before ending the meeting, Dr. Gautam thanked Dr. Ramesh Kharel and the Management Division for providing the information on COVID-19 logistics needs, gaps and procurement plans and GNI for providing COVID-19 support through one door mechanism. He also thanked all the participants of the meeting for their presence and kind support in COVID-19 response.

- Procurement of quality assured and compatible laboratory items (reagents) for support
- Provide support to hub hospitals for expansion of isolation facilities including ventilators, oxygen concentrators
