# 15th NATIONAL NUTRITION CLUSTER MEETING Via ZOOM LINK KATHMANDU, NEPAL

FRIDAY, 5th Asadh 2077 (19th June 2020)

The nutrition cluster was officially activated, led by the Family Welfare Division (FWD) of Department of Health Services (DoHS) of Ministry of Health and Population (MoHP) to initiate nutrition preparedness and response actions to address nutrition issues in existing Covid-19 targeting to under five years children, pregnant and lactating women and elderly (60 years plus) population. This is the 15th meeting after activating the nutrition cluster for COVID-19 preparedness and response. The meeting was chaired by Mr. Kedar Raj Parajuli, Chief of Nutrition Section of FWD/DoHS/MoHP as well as Nutrition Cluster lead of Federal Level Nutrition Cluster and co-chaired by the Mr. Anirudra Sharma, Nutrition Specialist UNICEF as well as Cluster co-lead. Altogether 150 plus people from different organizations were invited out of which 97 plus attended via zoom link.

- Supporting local levels in management of quarantine camps, relief distribution and information collection from 1000 days household's. Till now 4247 G1000D households received relief support.
- SUAAHARA team has been working for related risk communication and community engagement programs as follows:
  - Ongoing phone counselling, Bhanchhin aama radio services, SMS etc Provided counselling service to 10,063 HH in this week.
  - Technical officer and Frontline workers Contacted 176 Health facility and 950 FCHVs and take update about health and nutrition related service in community level.
- People have started to come for regular services at HFs. All birthing centers are open and continuing their service.
- All HF level services are in place. Except some HF who are engage in quarantines.
- Immunization programs are started most of centers.
- Suaahara Front line workers are advocating/supporting with palika for allocate budget in health and nutrition sector

- Develop plan for quarantine camps, isolated wards and boarder entry points as agreed previous nutrition cluster meeting
- Identify the numbers of under five children and PLWs in quarantine camps and isolated wards.
- Facilitate to continue the NRH of Koshi and Okhaldhunga hospital and coordinate with Khotang Hospital to initiate NRH services
- Supplementation of Vitamin A capsules to 6-59 months children
- Coordinate with the MSNP District Coordinators, SUAAHARA team and local levels for the fast utilization of the unspent fund for Comprehensive Nutrition Specific Interventions Training and Adolescent nutrition training and utilize the fund for the COVID-19 related nutrition activities in palikas of Panchthar, Bhojpur, Khotang and Udaypur districts.

#### Province number 2:

### Mr. Harishchandra Shah, the Director of Provincial Health Directorate (PHD) of province number 2 briefed the following points:

- Provincial Health and Nutrition Cluster meeting was organized on 11 June 2020. All the Chiefs of Health offices were present.
- Province 2 is ready for the Vitamin A supplementation through FCHVs.
- Decided to provide the nutritional care to the children and women staying at Quarantine sites and Isolation wards through the local levels and health workers.
- Major interventions will be- MUAC screening, distribution of Vitamin A, Albendazole, MNP, breastfeeding and complementary feeding counselling. For these we are expecting
  - Supply of commodities for Vitamin A supplementation as soon as possible e.g. Vitamin-A, Albendazole, Mask and Sanitizers.
  - Clear Directives must come from Nutrition Cluster to MoSD/PHD
  - Declare fixed date for implementation of Vitamin A Supplementation.
  - Supply for Masks and Sanitizers to health offices must be initiated by FWD/UNICEF.

- Follow up to endorse nutrition in emergency response plans (COVID-19 and Monsoon) for the province
- Continue nutrition service monitoring
- Prepare an action plan jointly with concerned district health office and implement for nutrition response to PLW and under five children at boarder entry points, quarantine camps and isolated wards.
- Identify the numbers of under five children and PLWs in quarantine camps and isolated wards.
- Supplementation of Vitamin A capsules to 6-59 months children
- Coordinate with the MSNP DCs and local levels for the fast utilization of the unspent fund for Comprehensive nutrition specific nutrition interventions and Adolescent nutrition training and utilize the fund for the COVID-19 related nutrition activities in all palikas of Saptari, Mahottari, Sarlahi, Rautahat, Bara, parsa, Dhanusa districts.

### **Bagmati province:**

Mr. Ramesh Adhikari and Mr. Shambhu Kafle, Director of Provincial Health Directorate and Public Health Administrator briefed following noints:

### Suaahara staffs continue supporting in FIVE districts for-

- Within this week phone counseling to Pregnant women- 794, Lactating mothers- 3223 and Total HHs reached-11427
- Suaahara technical staffs are Continuing follow up Health facilities.
   And within this week 55 OTCs are followed up and found 48 OTCs
   RUTF stock out and 7 HFs are stock out (MNP & VIT A)
- Within this week COVID -19 TOT has been completed for two districts (Rasuwa & Sindhupalchowk) for Health office chiefs and staffs and planning to conduct for remaining 3 districts.
- Continue supporting for airing Radio program and jingle from 14 FMs, Radio Nepal. In addition to this, a jingle related to covid prevention broadcasted in Thaha network and Kayakairan from yesterday (produced from PHD). SMS has been sending to pregnant and lactating mothers related to COVID, Health and Nutrition.

- Follow up with MoSD to endorse nutrition in emergency response plans (COVID-19 and Monsoon)
- Follow up with MoSD to endorse the TOR of health and nutrition cluster.
- Supplementation of Vitamin A capsules to 6-59 months children
- Continue nutrition service monitoring
- Finalize an action plan and implement for nutrition response to PLW and under five children in quarantine camps and isolated wards.
- Identify the numbers of under five children and PLWs in quarantine camps and isolated wards.
- All NRHs of Bagamati province are functional except Sindhupalchwok. Therefore, facilitate to continue the NRH of Sindhupalchwok.

- Within this week during Phone counseling-1830 HHs are found worry for food and 11 HHs are linked with local government food aid program and 28 COVID suspected cases referred to Health services for checkup.
- This week reported- 83 persons come back to home from out of country.
- One -Resource person (Dr) is supporting for province Health Directorate to carry out COVID activities.

### Coordinate with the SUAAHARA team and local levels for the fast utilization of the unspent fund for Adolescent nutrition training and utilize the fund for the COVID-19 related nutrition activities in palikas of Dolakha and Bhaktapur districts.

### Gandaki Province:

### Mr. Binod Bindu Sharma, Director of Provincial Health Directorate briefed the following points:

- Nutrition Response plan is reviewed and submitted to Ministry of Social Development, Gandaki Province.
- Three children are admitted in Parbat NRH. Because of isolation site nearby Dhaulagiri Hospital the NRH is unable to be resumed.
- It's coordinated to Dhaulagiri Hospital and came to know that it's not
  possible to resume NRH due to isolation site nearby the NRH.
- Altogether, 37 Out-patient Therapeutic treatment Centers (OTCs) are providing services but very less children with their caretakers are visiting for services.
- Gandaki Province HD had coordinated with districts and they are ready to implement National Vitamin A supplementation campaign.
- Suaahara Program has been supporting different Risk communication & Community engagement activities considering Nutrition and COVID-19 and till date telephone counseling to total: 1,22,566 Households, whereas within this week to total of 10,873 Households. Also Broadcasting 15 PSAs per day by16 local FM Radios.
- In collaboration & coordination with Province Health Directorate, Suaahara program has conducted District level orientation on COVID 19 considering nutrition in Myagdi, Baglung, Gorkha and Nawalpur districts.
- MSNP volunteers have been advocating to the local leaders for the relief distribution to 1000 days' beneficiaries and quarantine management in Nawalpur District.

- Finalize and endorse nutrition in emergency response plans (COVID-19 and Monsoon) for the province
- Follow up to endorse the ToR of health and nutrition cluster.
- Supplementation of Vitamin A capsules to 6-59 months children
- Continue nutrition service monitoring
- Continue identify the numbers of under five children and PLWs in quarantine camps and isolated wards.
- Prepare an action plan and implement for nutrition response to PLW and under five children in quarantine camps and isolated wards.
- Coordinate with the MSNP DC and SUAAHARA team and local levels for the fast utilization of the unspent fund for Comprehensive Nutrition Specific Training and Adolescent training and utilize the fund for the COVID-19 related nutrition activities in palikas of Manang and Nawalparasi East and West.

### Province number 5:

### Mr. Roshan Raj Chaudhary, Director of Provincial Health Directorate briefed the following points:

- Radio PSA on breastfeeding in COVID-19 context is ongoing with support from UNICEF and plan for miking at ward levels.
- ACF is working to disseminate brochure with nutrition messages in Nawalparasi.
- Advocate to Ministry of Social Development ongoing to include data of PLWs and under-five children through formal system. And to discuss this concern requesting to held meeting by next week.
- Follow up to endorse nutrition in emergency response plan (Monsoon and COVID-19)
- Follow up to finalize endorse the ToR of health and nutrition cluster.
- Continue nutrition service monitoring focusing to OTCs, NRH (Nepalgunj) and others.
- Prepare an action plan and implement for nutrition response to PLW and under five children in quarantine camps and isolated wards as well as in the boarder entry point.
- Supplementation of Vitamin A capsules to 6-59 months children
- Coordinate with the MSNP Dc and SUAAHARA team and local levels for the fast utilization of the unspent fund for Comprehensive Nutrition Specific Training and Adolescent nutrition training and utilize the fund for the COVID-19 related nutrition activities in palikas of Rupandehi, Kapilvastu, Rolpa, Pyuthan, Dang, Banke, Bardiya, Rukum East districts.

### Karnali province:

### Ms. Mana Kumari Gurung, Public Health Nurse of Provincial health Directorate briefed the following points:

- Health and nutrition cluster formed/functional, MSNP supporting nutrition mainstreaming in 60 Palikas of 8 programme districts,
- Follow up to endorse nutrition in emergency response plan (Monsoon and COVID-19)
- Follow up to finalize endorse the ToR of health and nutrition cluster.
- Supplementation of Vitamin A capsules to 6-59 months children

- nutrition and food security committees (NFSSC) activated at ward/Palika/HF level, and supporting delivery of regular health and nutrition services
- Monsoon preparedness plan drafted by UNICEF and under review of Health Service Directorate with support from UNICEF
- Distribution of Super Cereal started/ongoing in 71 HFs for June 2020 out of 128 HFs across 5 Karnali districts under MCHN programme jointly by the Government and WFP
- 105,436 HHs reached and counseled by 250 staff in 5 districts, supporting human resource, escalating public awareness on COVID – 19 with radio programme, capacity building and technical support ongoing, with overall support of Suaahara.
- Save the children supporting 12 Palikas to improve RMNCHN in programme districts and nutrition messaging and SSBH continuing to work on health system strengthening for the local governments as usual.

- Continue nutrition service monitoring focusing to OTCs, NRH, MCHN and others.
- Link MSNP with IMAM and other nutrition services
- Prepare an action plan and implement for nutrition response to PLW and under five children in quarantine camps and isolated wards.
- Continue to identify the numbers of under five children and PLWs in quarantine camps and isolated wards.
- Coordinate with the MSNP Dc and SUAAHARA team and local levels for the fast utilization of the unspent fund for Comprehensive Nutrition Specific Training, Adolescent training and utilize the fund for the COVID-19 related nutrition activities in palikas of Dailekh, Jajarkot, Surkhet, Rukum west, Kalikot, Jumla, Humla, Dolpa, Mugu districts.

### **Sudur Paschim province:**

### Mr Gunaraj Awasthi and Mr. Min Raj Joshi from Provincial Health Directorate of Sudurpaschim Province briefed the following points:

- Health and Nutrition cluster meeting is conducted biweekly.
- With the support from UNICEF and SUAAHARA, nutrition BCC messages are been aired in three different languages (Nepali, Doteli and Tharu) regularly from different 42 Local FMs (19 from UNICEF and 23 from SUAAHARA) of the province covering all districts of the province.
- This week total 22,710 (Total 2,34,910 HHs) Households are counselled by SUAAHARA front line worker and 39 Health Facilities counselling done by SUAAHARA technical officers for support to reviving the services, sent push massage to HHs, expert interview conducted and send massage thorough social media about COVID-19 and Nutrition promotion.
- SUAAHARA, UNICEF and MoFAGA-MSNP team regularly following up for SAM management (New Admission SAM case 9, Phone follow up SAM Case 32 by Suaahara)
- MSNP team had distributed Nutrition bag to 230 G1000 day HHs.

- Finalize and endorse nutrition in emergency response plan (Monsoon and COVID-19)
- Continue nutrition service monitoring focusing to OTCs, NRH (Kanchanpur and Dadeldhura hospital).
- Supplementation of Vitamin A capsules to 6-59 months children
- It is needed to prepare an action plan and implement for nutrition response to PLW and under five children in quarantine camps and isolated wards as well as in the boarder entry points.
- Continue to identify the numbers of under five children and PLWs in quarantine camps and isolated wards
- Coordinate with the MSNP DC and SUAAHARA team and local levels for the fast utilization of the unspent fund for Comprehensive Nutrition Specific training and Adolescent training and utilize the fund for the COVID-19 related nutrition activities in the palikas of Kanchanpur, Dadeldhura, Baitadi, Bajhang, Bajura, Achham, Doti districts.

### **Technical Working Group (TWG)**

#### **Information Management (IM) TWG:**

Ms. Sangeeta Paudel, Chair of IM TWG explained the following points in nutrition cluster:

- Third round of the information collection is ongoing. And today is the deadline for the submission.
- Exploring opportunities for the integration of nutrition indicators in MoHP information system
- Discussion ongoing for the quarantine information management
- IM TWG had already finalized monthly bulletin and waiting for approval from the lead and co-lead to share with the cluster members and in places where needed.
- Coordinate M&E section of MoHP jointly with assessment TWG and develop common tools for health and nutrition jointly with health and reproductive health cluster.
- Develop integration of services of all the sectors by which the people who are staying at quarantine will be benefitted.

### Micro-nutrient (MN) TWG:

### Mr. Naveen Paudel, the Chair of MN TWG briefed the following points:

 MN TWG developed VAS guideline aligning with GAVA recommendation. VAS guideline in both English and Nepali version are available.  Develop E-training/orientation module to FCHVs for National Vitamin -A CAMPAIGN in consultation with the Nutrition Cluster- BCC Technical Working Group. • MN TWG meeting held on 17 June 2020 from 14:30 to 15:30 hours endorsed the guideline for further submission to Nutrition Cluster.

**Endorsement:** Nutrition Cluster has approved VAS guideline both in English and Nepali version and will endorse from MoHP within this week.

#### IYCF TWG:

### On behalf of IYCF TWG, Ms Bhim Kumari Pun, Chair of IYCF TWG brief as follows

- It is essential to ensure protection, promotion and support for exclusive breast feeding (0-6 months children) and complementary feeding in quarantines.
- Monitoring of BMS is required and ensure dissimilation of IYCF messages in line with the guidelines.
- Nutrition cluster co-lead had shared the agenda for interaction with MoHP secretary to activate of Breast-Feeding Protection (BPP) committee.
- Work with NIS TWG for developing tool and establish a mechanism to collect information on 1000 days' women & children from quarantines including isolation
- Coordinate and sensitize to food cluster on protection, promotion and support for exclusive breast-feeding complementary feeding in quarantines

### **IMAM TWG**

### On behalf of IMAM TWG, Mr Sujay Nepali Bhattacharya, Chair of IMAM TWG briefed the following as:

- Interim SOP for Blanket Supplementary Feeding Programme (BSFP) targeting children 6-23 months and PLW has been translated into Nepali with the support from Action Against Hunger (ACF). It has been presented to the National Nutrition Cluster on 12 June 2020 for endorsement process.
- Family / mother MUAC Operational Guidance Note has been revised and finalized both in English and Nepali with the support from Action against Hunger (ACF) and has submitted to Nutrition cluster today for endorsement process.
- IMAM TWG members have received revised 'ToR/Protocol for assessment of Nutrition Rehabilitation Homes (NRHs)'. Need to explore supporting agencies for completion of the assessment. BCC TWG is supporting in the development of family/mother MUAC video and take away cards/message for mothers/caretakers.
- NRH assessment tool has been completed and are working to to identify
  agencies to support questionnaire designing, data collection, analysis
  and report writing. If any organization is keen to support, please inform
  us.
- With our request BCC working group is making take away card for mothers/caretakers regarding Mother MUAC approach which helps and supports them to understand and recall it easily at any time.
- Selection criteria for Blanket supplementary Feeding program has been submitted to the concerned authority. We also got an opportunity to learn about Vulnerability Index and selection Criteria for BSFP through team of WFP in IMAM TWG meeting. And would like to request through nutrition cluster that if any agencies are planning to distribute relief package and SFP (eg Save the Children and World Vision International) then would plan based on the criteria set by WFP.
- IMAM TWG already finalized Family MUAC approach and submitted to nutrition cluster for endorsement. MUAC tapes will be available from UNICEF. After its availability of MUAC tapes, TWG will further discuss in the team and will come with planning in cluster meeting.

Endorsement: The concept note of Family MUAC approach has been endorsed from nutrition cluster and recommend to FWD/DoHS for approval

- Follow-up with TOR/Protocol received from Assessment TWG
- Exit strategy for BSFP as the program will go maximum for 2 or 3 months only.

### **BCC TWG:**

### On behalf of BCC TWG Kunj Joshi, chair of BCC briefed as:

BCC TWG have the contact number of FCHVs

• Follow up and complete Nutrition App which is under development

- PSAs on IYCF-E and breastfeeding during COVID-19 being broadcast by over 120 radio stations across 42 Suaahara program districts, Ujyalo and Thaha News Network.
- Breast-feeding decision flex design prepared and sent to districts for printing and hanging at quarantine centers and health facilities
- Draft poster prepared on importance of breastfeeding and complementary feeding, maternal nutrition
- Two episodes of "corona care" television programme discuss about nutrition issues. The episodes of having local food and its nutrition value. The discussion was with "Kalpana Tiwari".
- Working on the animation video on breastfeeding by COVID-19 infected or symptomatic or for isolation mothers.
- Breast-feeding decision tree in the context of COVID-19 Flex designs is in the working progress which will soon be sent to quarantine centers and health facilities

- Breast-feeding decision tree in the context of COVID-19 – Flex designs to finalized and after endorsement will soon be sent to quarantine centers and health facilities.
- To develop a take home card/message slip for mothers on steps of MUAC measurement and family /mother video.
- BCC working group will include in all the materials (print, audio and visual) developed for emergency nutrition activities. Organizations can use the materials with due acknowledgement to the organization developing the materials. Need for developing the standard one material and use by all the organization. This will help to ensure the sharing of same messages and materials for better branding and visibility
- Three episodes of "Corona care to discuss on agriculture and nutrition in the week of June 29- July 4.

### **Nutrition Assessment Group:**

### Mr. Sanjay Rijal, Chair of Nutrition Assessment Group updated the following points:

- Assessment Technical Working Group developed a guideline/protocol for SMART Survey in context of COVID-19.
- A protocol with questionnaire was developed on "Rapid Assessment of NRH" on request of IMAM technical working group.
- Finalization of a guideline/protocol for SMART Survey in context of COVID-19 and translate into Nepali for endorsement

### Remarks from Dr. Dipendra Raman Singh, Director General (DG) of Department of Health Services (DoHS)

- Thanked to the Honourable member of NPC Dr. Usha Jha, nutrition cluster lead, co-lead, provincial directorates and representatives, all nutrition cluster members and all participants of the meeting for doing such a wonderful job in this situation.
- Felt good to hear that basic health and nutrition services have been started its own pace prior to as normal situation.
- Activeness of nutrition cluster at national and provincial levels shows more ownership on health and nutrition services.
- He had requested to share the update and presentations later on for the recommendation, feedback and suggestion if any,
- He also appreciated the network made by nutrition cluster and want this to go on increasing manner to improve health and nutrition status.
- He thanked to all the provincial team and stakeholders for the support, guidance by providing basic health services at all levels.
- He also appreciated to all for their hard work at all levels to address nutrition issues on COVID-19 and non COVID-19 Context.
- He also promised to participate in every nutrition cluster meeting and be a part of it.

### Remarks from Dr. Usha Jha, Honorable member of the national Planning Commission:

- She started by thanking to nutrition lead and co-lead for managing and going ahead for nutrition program through the zoom meeting.
- She admires that nutrition team has been working vigorously and feel very proud to be part of this team and shared that she will be in zoom meeting on every Friday.
- She also requested federal and provincial health directorates to utilize the budget through re-planning and reimbursement for the management of Blanket Supplementary Feeding Program (BSFP).
- She appreciated that this is one of the examples of a strong coordinated effort at different levels and requested to take in the long-term approach to improve the health and nutrition status of boys and girls of all age groups of Nepal.
- Basic health and nutrition services should be continued in regular manner to prevent from disease and malnutrition; and
  Government workers, development partners or stakeholders to work together for advocacy, lobby and providing the services
  for the prevention, control and management COVID-19 context.
- Finally, Dr. Usha Jha thanked to all participants of the cluster meeting.

### **Status of nutrition supplies:**

- 5,000,000 Vitamin A capsules arrived in Nepal last week and it is planned to initiate Vitamin A supplementation nationwide by Ashadh 2077
- 1000 cartons plus RUTF has been transported to different Outpatient Therapeutic Centres (OTCs) nationwide and 90% OTCs have RUTF stock for the treatment of Severe Acute Malnutrition
- UNICEF procured 2,000 cartons RUTF, 250,000 MUAC tapes, 300 cartons of F100 and 250 cartons of F75

### Nutrition in emergency preparedness:

- National Nutrition cluster finalized COVID-19 response plan and Monsoon response preparedness plan and endorsed from nutrition cluster
- All 7 provinces have prepared nutrition in emergency response preparedness plan for Monsoon emergency response as well as COVID-19 response
- Planning to manage Vitamin A capsules, RUTF and other nutrition commodities at Provincial Health Logistic Management
- Available of Supercereal for the blanket supplementary feeding programme targeting to 6-23 months children, pregnant and lactating women in five Karnali districts and Solukhumbu district

### **Next Steps:**

- Support to continue existing nutrition services
- Implement blanket supplementary feeding programme in Province number 2 and WFP has been planning to implement BSFP in four districts (Saptari, Sarlahi, Rautahat and Siraha)
- Collection of the status of under five children, pregnant and lactating women in point of entry and quarantine camps and nutrition support to them
- Management of nutrition commodities in all 7 provinces
- Readiness to address nutrition issues in monsoon emergency areas

### **Challenges**

- Screening children continues to be a challenge in the COVID-19 context making it difficult to identify SAM children for treatment.
- Nutrition Cluster has identified a need to prevent acute malnutrition by implementing blanket supplementary feeding to 6-59 months children, pregnant and lactating women in those districts with multiple vulnerabilities; pre-existing high level of wasting, flood prone and COVID-19 affected. However, management of super cereal for blanket supplementary feeding is a big gap.
- Supply gap of Therapeutic food for 8,000 children with Severe Acute Malnutrition (8,000 cartons RUTF)
- There is a need to define the nutrition response for children under five years of age and pregnant and lactating women at boarder entry points and quarantine sites.
