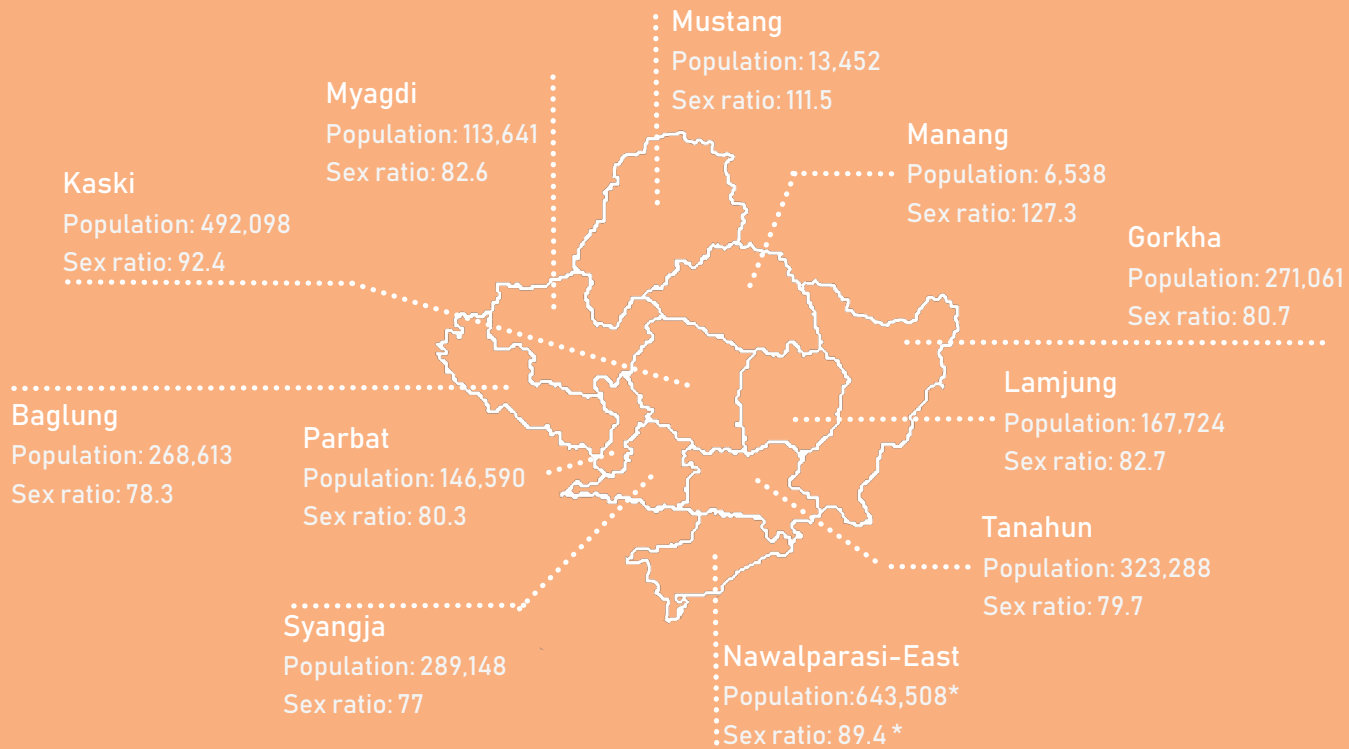

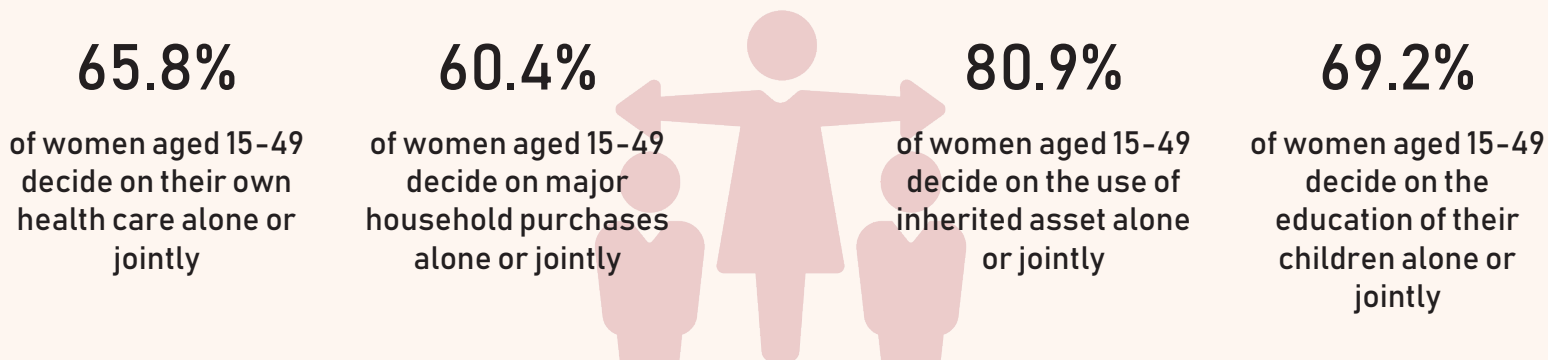

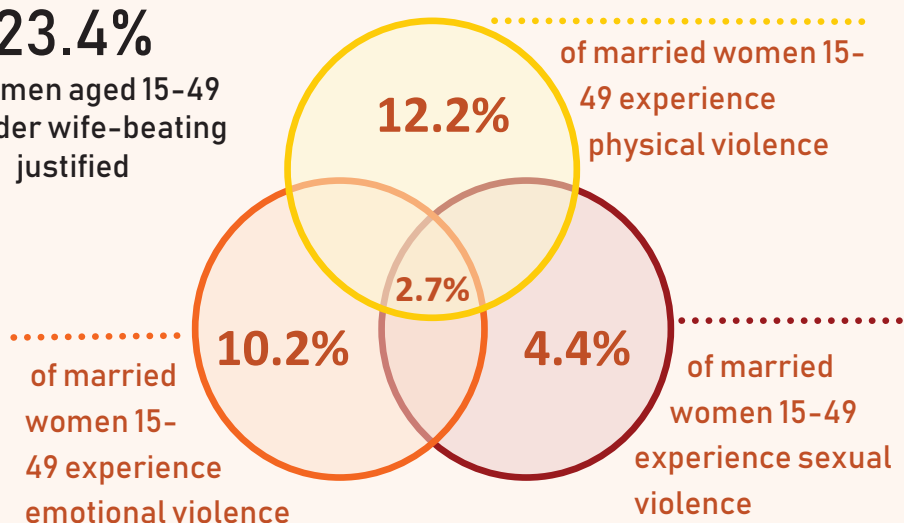

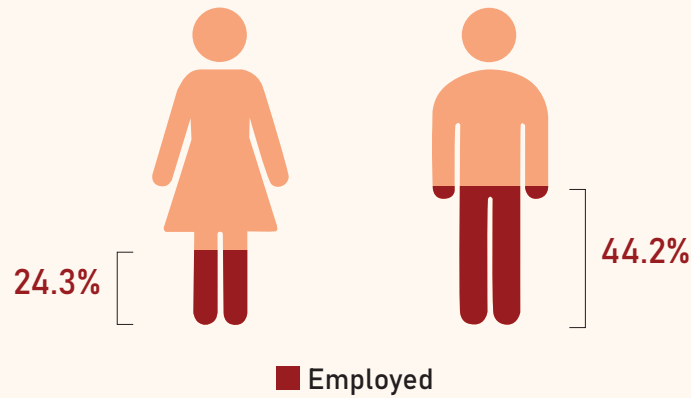

## EMPLOYMENT TO POPULATION RATIO <sup>18</sup>

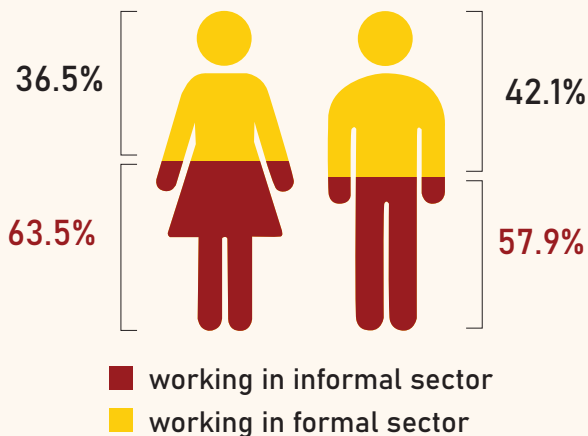

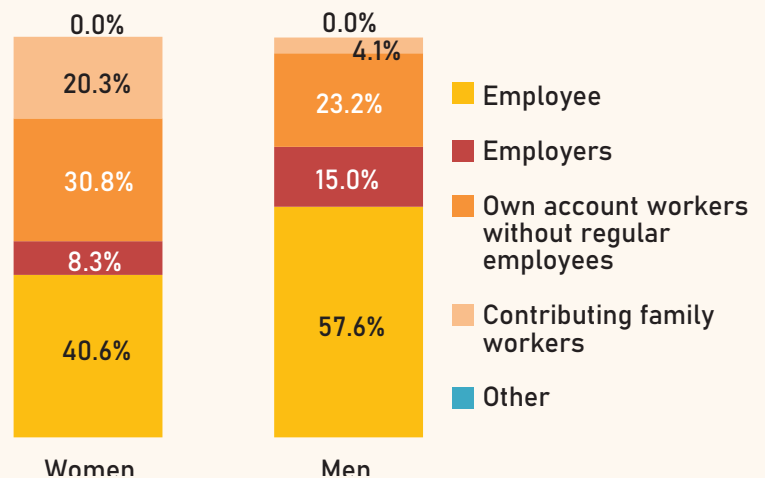

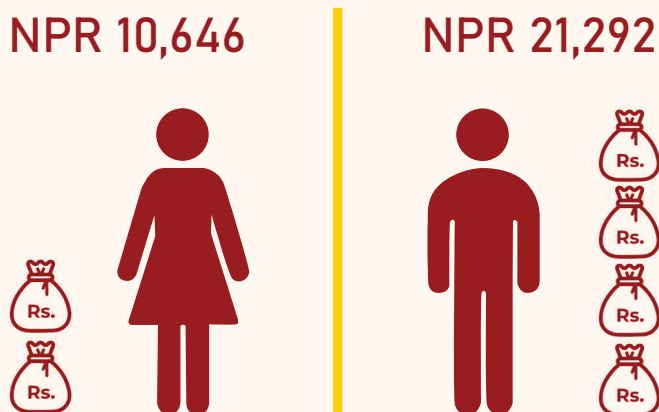
## EMPLOYMENT BY SECTOR <sup>20</sup>



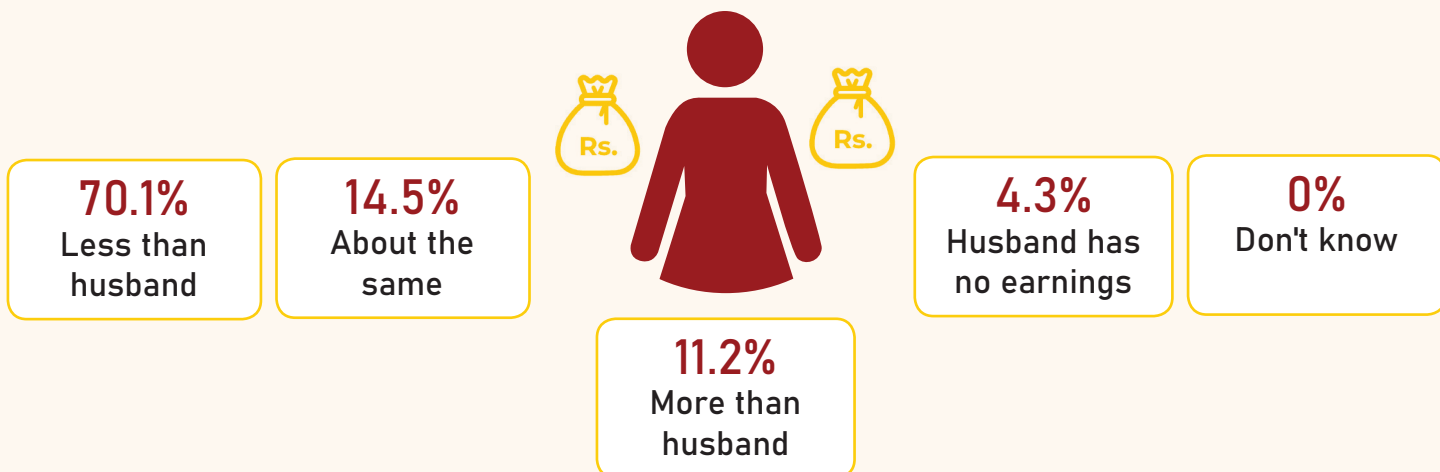
## STATUS IN EMPLOYMENT <sup>21</sup>



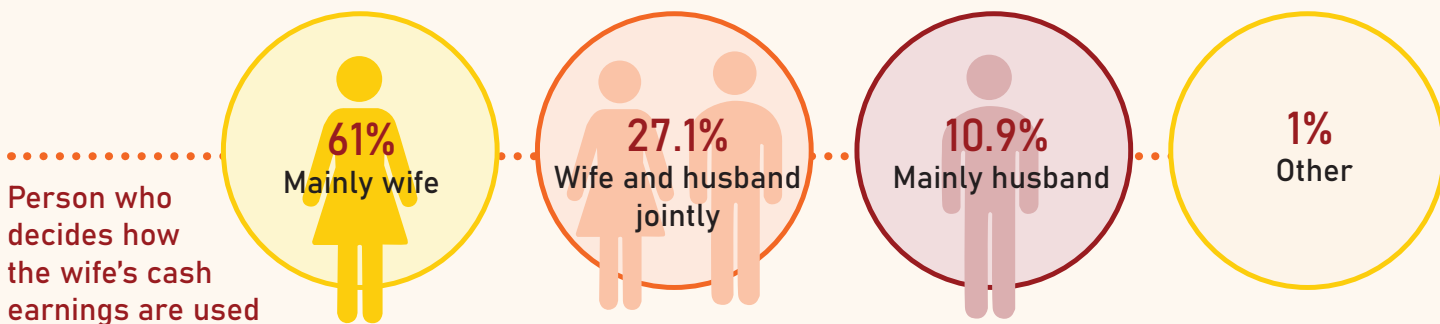
